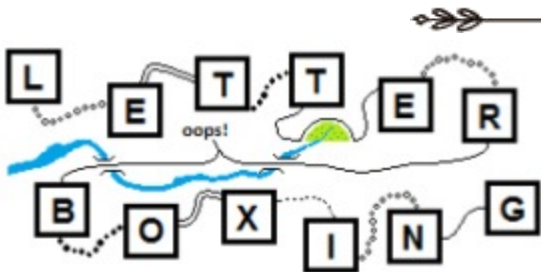

The Warren County Planning Department made a decision to retire the First Wilderness Letterboxing Challenge on December 1, 2023 so we can concentrate on two new exciting letterbox related projects:

1. We're getting ready to launch a new mobile app called "Explore Warren County" in 2024. It will include an audio tour to go along with the Historians' Challenge Letterboxing Trail,

among other cool stuff, including an audio driving tour of the First Wilderness, an audio walking tour of North Creek, & digital badges.

2. We'll be launching Letterbox the Bikeway in the spring of 2024. This will be a collaborative project between the First Wilderness department and the County Historian's office and will focus on French and Indian War and Revolutionary War history along the County bikeway, in preparation for the celebrations of the 250th anniversary of the Revolutionary War.

We'd love to make a strong final push to get people to finish up their First Wilderness passports before December 1st.
